The **EU-funded Be Secure Feel Secure (BSFS)** project is an **excellent example of how urban security can be co-produced** by involving different stakeholders in a participatory approach. The project involved local authorities, citizens, and other stakeholders, who collaborated to co-produce efficient solutions to urban security issues.

The project provided tailored and evidence-based policies to address security-related challenges in the local context, including a baseline assessment, the creation of a Local Council for Crime Prevention, the CURIM platform and a Victim Support Unit.

These mechanisms and tools provide the local stakeholders with up-to-date knowledge of the local reality concerning crime and insecurity. These

interventions, coupled with social and spatial interventions, contributed to improving the quality of life and to making Piraeus a safer and more secure city.
